“BATTLE OF THE BOOKS”



"America's Battle of the Books is a voluntary reading incentive program for students in grades 3-6. The purpose is simply to encourage students to read good books and have fun while competing with peers."

We are excited to kick off Battle of the Books this year at Highland Elementary! Interested students will be part of a team of 4 or 5 students. Each team member will choose 4 to 5 books to read; however, we encourage students to read as many books as they would like from their grade list.

There are 20 books on each grade level list. In March, teams will come together for a game-show style tournament during school where they will work as a team to answer questions about the books on the list.

Students do not have to read every book on the list, however, the more books each person on the team reads, the better chance they have during a battle.

The questions that will be given during the tournament are written like this example.

Question: In what book is there a dog named Watch? Answer: Boxcar Children by Warner
(THE ANSWER IS ALWAYS A TITLE & AUTHORS' LAST NAME)

All activities for Battle of the Books will be held during school hours.
