

Computers and Bevices in the School for Student Use- Mount Mahogany has iMac, Mac Mini, or MacBook Pro stationary or mobile labs- In total we have two hundred eight devices for students. As a school we use four mobile carts - two carts are for Ipads and two carts are Apple lap tops.

Management - Mount Mahogany is using LanSchool as a management tool for devices or labs.

Supervision - Mount Mahogany has teachers and students trained with NetSmarts, a program where internet users become aware of inappropriate use of the internet.

Digital Citizenship Plan - Our technology is managed through the media center. We have a rotation where each grade level is given equal time with our devices. We have have held school wide training on Internet safety in school assemblies and during our school Safety Week through our PTA.

ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

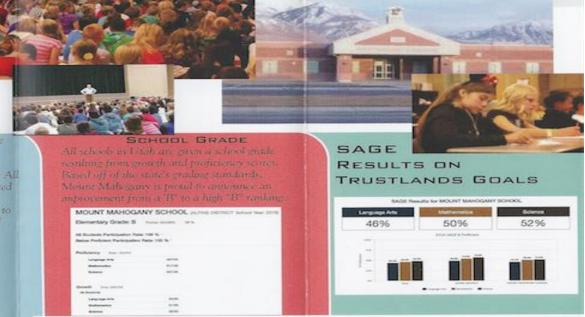

How Growth Was Achieved

To achieve the school's Trust Lands goals, the school created an improvement plan. Grade levels developed a list of essential standards from the new Utah Common Core that all students in that grade would master fully before entering into the next grade. Teachers created common assessments for students to take and show mastery with an essential standard. The teachers at Mount Mahogany use Monday collaborations to discuss specific needs of students based off of those common assessments. All grade levels now have essential standards and common assessments to determine when a student has mastered that standard. During Monday collaboration, teachers create lessons for students who need reteaching, extensions, or simply more time practicing a standard. We also have bought a program, Mastery Connect, that stores the data on the students' weekly assessments and progress. Mastery Connect has been very helpful to see students' mastery individually by the standard. We have also bought an additional lpad cart to help students achieve more mastery on essential standards through interventions and whole group instruction.
